Easter Paraments—The Jerusalem Cross

And it came to pass, when the time had come that He should be received up, He steadfastly set His face to go to Jerusalem. Luke 9:51

For many centuries, the cross design on the pulpit banner has been used to represent Jerusalem, or "The Holy City." For the first disciples, this place of despair and defeat became the highest peak of celebration and victory. We have 24 backpacks to fill by Christmas, so we would like to collect items each month to fill the bags.


